Dog Etiquette

We're delighted to welcome well-behaved dogs to our accommodation. As we are based on a working yard with machinery, horses, cats, peacocks, chickens, and other livestock, it's important that all guests with dogs follow the guidelines below to ensure a safe and enjoyable stay for everyone.

General Expectations

- Maximum of 2 dogs per stay, unless agreed in advance.
- Dogs must be fully house-trained and well socialised.
- Please ensure your dog is flea-treated before arrival.

Supervision & Control

- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times when outside the enclosed accommodation area.
- Fields located on the estate are not for public use.
- Do not approach or enter working areas.
- Children and dogs should be supervised near fences and gates.
- It is **essential** that all gates are closed and secured after use.
- We request that any dog displaying aggressive or uncontrollable behaviour be removed from the premises.

Inside the Accommodation

- Dogs are not permitted on beds or furniture unless on a pet blanket. Please bring your own dog bedding and towels.
- We provide basic cleaning materials, but please clean up any accidents or muddy paws indoors (not with the white bathroom towels).
- Dogs must never be left alone in the property or yard, unless crated and calm. Barking or distressed dogs may disturb others on site.

Clean-up Policy

- Please pick up after your dog immediately and dispose of waste in one of the green bins on site.
- Do a final property check before departure damage or additional cleaning may incur a supplementary fee.





Heating Instructions

Sheerglass, The Granary, The Stalls, and The Hayloft all have underfloor heating throughout. All living areas and bedrooms are controlled by thermostats in each area and can be adjusted to suit.

Please do not adjust settings in the main control panel.

Hayloft Thermostat Location

In the main living area on the wall next to the Juliet balcony doors.

Stalls Thermostat Location

On the wall next to the front door.

Granary Thermostat Location

On the wall downstairs, outside the bedrooms.

Sheerglass Thermostat Location

One located in each zone/area.

Sheerglass - Gas fires

There are two gas fires within the property.

Upstairs Living Room:

Remove the grill from the bottom of the unit. Turn dial to IGN and push in. Keep dial pushed in for 10 seconds then slowly turn the dial to increase the flames. To turn off the fire, turn dial to OFF.

Downstairs Seating Area:

Open Lower door, turn dial to the spark symbol and push in. Press red button to ignite. Keep dial pushed in for 10 seconds then slowly turn dial to increase the flames. To turn off the fire, turn dial to OFF.





Transport: Bus

Explore the Isle of Man easily using Bus Vannin, the Island's extensive bus network, which serves the whole Island, including the airport and sea terminal. Buses run every 20 minutes to and from Port Erin and Douglas during the day, and every 30 minutes off-peak, seven days a week.

Get the best sight-seeing experience with a Go Explore card that allows unlimited travel on the Steam Railway, Manx Electric Railway, Snaefell Mountain Railway, Douglas Horse Trams and buses. You can buy Go Explore cards online or in person at the Welcome Centre at the sea terminal in Douglas.

Heritage Transport

The isle of man has three heritage railways that offer a fun way to visit the Island's ancient monuments and heritage sites, whilst enjoying beautiful views of the Manx countryside and extensive coast. You can choose to travel by steam or electric railway. The railways are perfectly preserved in time, operating with original rolling stock. The Steam Railway takes you to Castletown, Port Erin and Ballasalla. The Manx Electric Railway takes you to Laxey. Here you can visit the largest working waterwheel in the world and learn about the Island's mining history. The Snaefell Mountain Railway takes you to the top of the Island's only mountain, with panoramic views of the "Seven Kingdoms".

Explore the Island's awe-inspiring landscapes and outdoor natural playground. The stunning and expansive coastline provides some of the best water sports in the Irish Sea. Kayaking, paddleboarding, diving or coasteering offer unique perspectives of the Island. With a hundred miles of coastline, you'll have plenty to explore. It is not uncommon to spot all kinds of sea life around our coast, including basking sharks, bottlenose dolphins, harbour porpoise, minke whales and grey seals.

Motorsport

For over a century, the Isle of Man has played host to the renowned TT Races. Thrilling roads traverse through dramatic scenery and quaint towns, captivating competitors and spectators alike. The challenging 37 and 34 mile Mountain Course attracts thousands of visitors a year from across the globe who come to witness his world-class, exhilarating road race. Equally hair-raising events on two wheels include the Southern 100 and the Festival of Motorcycling (formerly the Manx Grand Prix). Not to be forgotten are the numerous car meets throughout the year, including The Manx Autosport Rally and International Classic Rally.

When not hosting races, the courses are public roads, which means visitors can experience tours of the track used to test the world's top riders. Why not take a scenic drive on the course or sit back and enjoy the ride on a trike tour, luxury car or minibus.

*Please note, if you have arrived during one of the Island's motorsport events, some roads may be closed at certain times. You can check road closures by looking at the Isle of Man Constabulary page on Facebook, tuning in to Manx Radio, or looking at the corresponding event's website.

Monuments and Landmarks

Since the end of the last Ice Age, the Isle of man has developed a unique and varied history, shaped by those who made it their home.

Explore the island's burial grounds, Neolithic tombs and the most extensive collection of Celtic and Norse crosses.



Visit Tynwald Hil, a distinct landmark representing the Island's strong and independent identity. See the impressive "Lady Isabella", the largest working waterwheel in the world, and take the Manx Electric Tram to the top of Snaefell for panoramic views from the highest point on the Isle of Man at 621 meters above sea level. On a clear day, you will be rewarded by the sight of the seven kingdoms – England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, the Isle of Man and the kingdoms of heaven and the sea. Dominating the Island's landscape in the south stands one of Europe's best-preserved medieval castles, Castle Rushen. On the west of the Island, you'll find the ancient fortress of Peel Castle on St. Patrick's Isle.



Walks and Hikes

The Isle of Man is a beautiful destination for those who enjoy walking. It offers rugged cliffs, rolling hills, picturesque glens, hidden coves, and breathtaking views. With various footpaths and trails, visitors can choose from a gentle stroll to a challenging hike.

Hiking is a popular activity on the Isle of Man due to the stunning scenery, which is considered some of the best in the British Isles. One of the most challenging hikes is the Raad Ny Foillan costal footpath, which circumnavigates the entire coast of the Isle of Man and covers over one hundred miles of outstanding natural beauty. Along the way, walkers can spot incredible wildlife and enjoy breathtaking views.

Besides challenging hikes, visitors can also discover hidden coves accessed through fern-filled glens, peaks covered with heather and gorse as well as vast sandy beaches that offer a sense of serenity and space. If you prefer to walk through the towns or go on a heritage tour, you will discover numerous fascinating stories and historical attractions to explore. Walkers may also stumble upon the remnants of the rich Celtic and Viking history.

Dark Skies/UNESCO Biosphere

The Isle of Man is the world's first whole jurisdiction designated as a UNESCO biosphere reserve. This recognises the Island's natural beauty and biodiversity, unique culture and heritage, as well as the community's efforts to create a sustainable future.

There are 26 official dark sky sites around the Island. Minimal light pollution means clear skies can reveal exceptional views of the Milky Way, nebulae and even the Northern Lights.



TV Input Source – changes your input source


 REC Record – records a program currently being viewed or schedules a recording from the Guide

Remote Control Quick Tips
